


# From doctors to hoop dreams: Unite your community to save lives



## Your genetic diversity

**African American and Black patients can have a harder time finding a donor than others.**

Patients are most likely to match someone who shares their heritage. Those who migrated out of Africa have gone to many places all over the globe. As a result, African Americans are 50 percent more genetically diverse than those of European-American heritage.



**Today, African Americans and Blacks comprise only eight percent of the registry. Many more are needed to save patients' lives.**
